The WRIM Lifetime Achievement Award is given to those for their contribution to the field of Malaria and their contribution and support to WRIM.

Professor Markus has a dual career. (A) Scientifically, he has worked in Africa on both obscure (mostly) and important parasites, but also has ornithological expertise. (B) He is a professional language practitioner in the UK (periodically); and is the person who coined the term "hypnozoite" for the stage that has been thought to cause relapse of malarial infections. A graduate of four institutions, including the London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine and Imperial College London. Prof Markus is also a Professor of Parasitology at the University of the Witwatersrand.
